THREE SPECIAL Awards were presented to students who had achieved exceptional progress or achievement.

Tim Kulak – Winner of the H&S Aviation Award, and the Special Award for Overall Outstanding Achievement. Since coming to the College in 2006, Tim has achieved Distinctions in both his First and National Diplomas and still found time to pass an AS level in Accounting. He is now studying at Bournemouth University to study for a First Class Honours degree.

Andrew Pannell – Winner of the College Award for Landbased Studies, and Special Award for Overall Outstanding Progress. Andy's first experience of college was as a 14+ student – he had been unsettled at school and it did not suit him. He

progressed through the qualification levels and is now in his second year of the National Diploma in Agriculture. After College he is going to University to continue his studies.

Luke Griffiths – Winner of the Award for Outstanding Skills Achievement. Having previously studied A levels Luke came to the College to study furniture making in 2005. In 2007, he won a bronze medal in the UK Skills national final and the following year took the gold medal. Luke was awarded a Medallion of Excellence for the world class quality of his cabinet making in the 2009 WorldSkills competition in Canada. Luke now works for furniture company Cimitree, as well as teaching in the workshops at College.

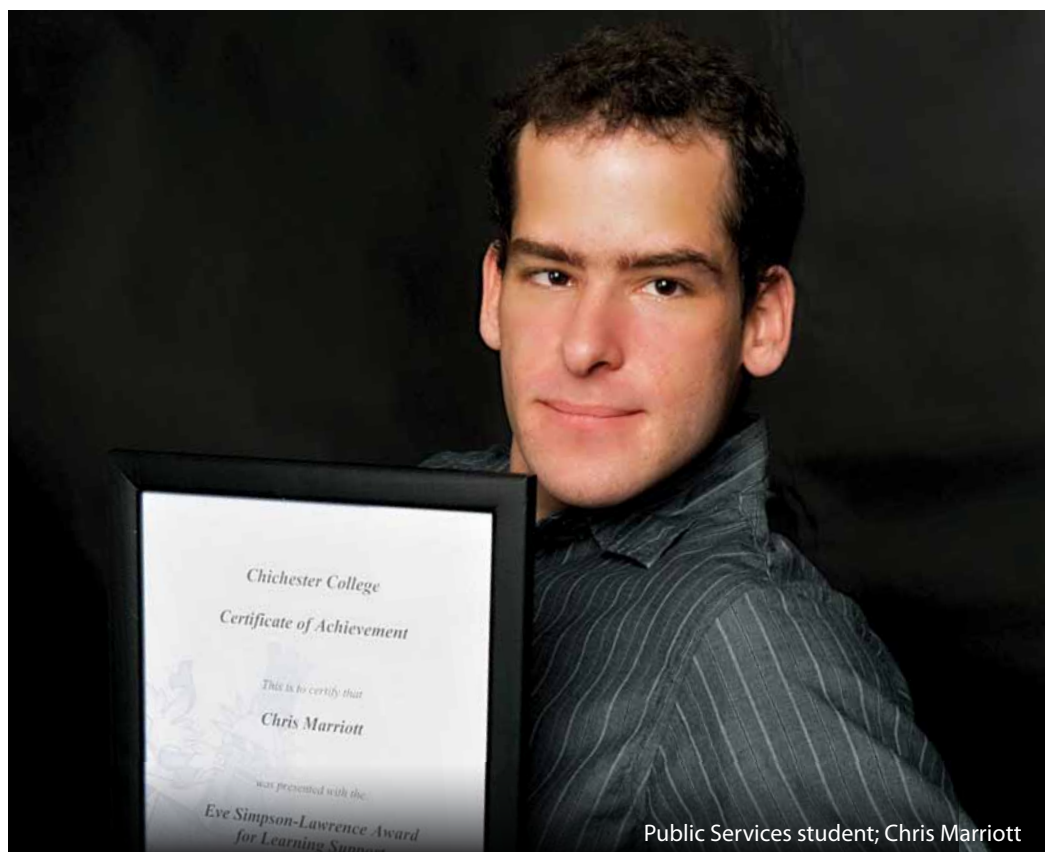
